- Curriculum Audit: Regularly audit the curriculum to ensure it includes diverse perspectives and materials that reflect various cultures and histories
- Resource Allocation Audit: Regular tracking of resources (e.g., books, media, teaching aids) reflect and support diversity and inclusion and are accessible, culturally responsive, and promote multiple backgrounds, identities, and experiences of students.





# School Development Plan Learning Excellence Actions

- Utilize high-impact strategies for reading, vocabulary, and word learning across all disciplines (worked examples, direct teaching, differentiated instruction)
- Utilize text sets that include a variety of multimodal primary and secondary sources, are culturally and linguistically diverse, and align with the discipline
- Include structured reading lessons and reading opportunities within content areas that reflect authentic comprehension tasks within the discipline

- Honour student voice and choice
- Provide repeated opportunities for learners to practice and consolidate literacy skills and knowledge within different disciplines
- Create learning spaces that provide learners with safe
